CELEBRATE FDR'S 130TH BIRTHDAY ON MONDAY, JANUARY 30, 2012!

"Let's celebrate Franklin Delano Roosevelt's 130th birthday on January 30, 2012 by remembering how FDR inspired hope during the darkest of times -- the Great Depression and the War," Stefan Lonce, author of the forthcoming book, *DRIVING WITH FDR* said.

"FDR was creative and resourceful; he found opportunity in adversity. After he was paralyzed by polio on August 10, 1921, FDR couldn't walk, but he could drive, using hand controls he designed. Driving gave FDR confidence that he could overcome his paralysis – he spent 7 years trying to walk again, but could only make it look like he was walking if he wore cumbersome metal leg braces, and grabbed onto someone's arm, while leaning on a cane," Lonce explained.

According to Lonce, "If FDR had not been able to drive, then he would not have run for Governor of New York in 1928: his Republican opponent attacked him as a 'cripple,' and being able to drive would have enabled FDR to *prove*, through photographs, that he was capable of being Governor. If FDR had not been elected Governor in 1928, then he would not have been elected President in 1932, and he would not have been able to rearm America and England, as he did during 1940 and 1941. Hitler would have won the War," Lonce concludes.
